Property description

In 2012, the Regional Municipality of Edward (now the Municipality of Two Borders) entered into an agreement with the Nature Conservancy of Canada to ensure the ongoing protection of the native prairie you see conserved at the Ralph Wang Trail.

This trail provides a glimpse into the past, when native prairie once stretched beyond the horizon. Today, grasslands like this are rare, as are many of the birds and plants you'll encounter along the trail.

1. From Pierson, drive west on Highway 3 for 1.6 kilometres.
2. Turn south (left) on Antler Road and proceed for 8.8 kilometres. Ralph Wang Trail is on the east (left) side of the road.
